Whereas, three Utahns died during the attacks of 9/11, including Mary Alice Wahlstrom and her daughter Carolyn Beug, who were aboard American Airlines Flight 11 when it was hijacked and flown into the World Trade Center North Tower, and Brady Howell, who was a Utah State graduate interning at the Pentagon when Flight 77 crashed into it;

Whereas, 62 members of the Utah Task Force 1 responded to Ground Zero to help in the efforts of recovery and rebuilding;
